



LEAGUE TO FREE ABYSSINIAN

Ras Taffari Will be Placed on the Carpet Next

Geneva, Aug. 18—(United Press)—
The fifth assembly of the League of Nations which has been summoned for Sept. 1, will be called upon to endeavor to settle the problem of slavery in virtually the only rémaining civilized country in which it is known to exist.

wide point of view on the will endeavor to recognize his country on a corresponding basis.

Nevertheless, the League has no intention whatsoever of counting exclusively upon Ras Taffari's sense of the general fitness of things to settle the problem. During the past year the League has addressed inquiries to virtually every government in the world.

This is Abyssinia.

The problem is all the more ticklish for the League, owing to the fact that Abyssinia is not only a member of the League, but she was admitted upon condition that she end at once the traffic of human beings in her territory.

In spite of this promise, reports coming to the League from both Abyssinia and neighboring countries indicate that slavery still exists. As a matter of fact, France, England and Italy are all maintaining, at their own expense, topedo boats off the coast of Abyssinia for the purpose of running down the boats on the Red Sea that endeavor to smuggle the slaves from Abyssinia across to Asia Minor where they are sold into the service of wealthy patrons.

While the League has addressed inquiries to virtually every government in the world on the subject.

The great bulk of these have now sent in what information they have on the subject their observations thereon, and their ideas of the best way to handle the problem.

In the meantime the League has created a commission of internalonal experts in colonial matters to study all these replies and formulate the best plan of action. This plan will be submitted to the September assembly for final action.


