TAMMANY AFTER


New York, Jan. 21—An important move in Tammany's plans to smother the presidential aspirations of William Gibbs McAdoo is seen in the introduction of a bill in the state legislature to change the voting system of the New York delegates at the national convention. Under the present rule the delegates, after the withdrawal of the candidate for whom they have been instructed, may use their discretion in voting for other candidates. The bill, which has just been introduced at Albany, provides that the state convention may require the delegates to a national convention to vote as a unit throughout the balloting.
