He covered 400 yards in four minutes 40 2-5 seconds; fourteen seconds faster than the previous record mark; reduced the time for 400 metres from 5 minutes 14 2-5 seconds to 5 minutes 81-6 seconds; set a new mark of 5 minutes 10 seconds for 590 yards, and shaved the 500 metre time from 5 minutes 56 3-5 seconds to 5 minutes, 52 seconds.


