LOCAL NEWS

While in Montreal Mayor Schiefel took up the matter of the number of salings of liners in the service of the Canadian Government Merchant Marine from this port, and he was assured that the same tonnage would be allotted to both St. John and Halifax.

The claim of the Bathurst Lumber Co. against the C. G. M. for towage was settled by arbitration in the board of trade rooms on Saturday morning by a panel consisting of J. Edgar Belyea, for the lumber company; C. T. Workman of Halifax, for the C. G. M., and Neil Hall of Halifax, as a third party.

While coasting down Duke street, a lad, thirteen years of age, struck an automobile, driven by J. Edgar Belyea, who was coming up Prince William street. He struck the car a glancing blow, and was not severely injured, but the impact of the collision caused him to bleed at the nose and mouth. Mr. Belyea made every effort to avoid the youngster.

The Pulp Workers' Union, Local 32, held a meeting yesterday afternoon at the Temperance Hall, Fairville. The meeting was addressed by Jacob Stephen, a representative of the International Brotherhood of Pulp, Sulphite and Paper Mill Workers. Mr. Stephen spoke of the benefits of organization. Mr. Stephen will leave on Tuesday for Berlin (N. H.).

A daring robbery was committed on Saturday evening when an apartment occupied by L. B. Wilson, 81 Wright street, was broken into and several articles of women's apparel taken. The entrance was made through the rear door and the door at the head of the stairs had apparently been broken in by a hammer, and when the occupant returned about 9.45 in the evening they found the furniture scattered about the room and articles of different kinds on the floor. It is also rumored that the thief entered the residence of a neighbor on the same street, but nothing was taken.

MEMORIAL TO SOLDIER DEAD

Tablet Unveiled Yesterday in Main Street Baptist Church.

A memorial tablet bearing eight names of members of the congregation who died in service during the war was unveiled in the Main street Baptist church yesterday. The act of unveiling was performed by Mrs. Alice Todd the name of whose son appears on the tablet. Rev. David Hutchinson, D. D. preached an eloquent sermon. Col. Murray MacLaren, C. M. G. gave a short address paying a tribute to the men who made the supreme sacrifice. Special music added dignity and inspiration to the service. In his sermon Dr. Hutchinson took for his text that verse from the 13th chapter of Romans which reads, "Honor to whom honor." Having spoken of the message and inspiration of such a ceremony he mentioned in turn each of the fallen men and told of their record of heroic service. He spoke of each one in the order in which they fell; Frank Thomas who was killed in November, 1915; George Todd, July 9, 1916; A. G. Lammon, killed at Mons; R. S. Wilson, September, 1916; Percy R. Allaby, killed at Vimy Ridge; B. H. Ferris, September, 1917; Frank A. Chesley, killed at Amiens on August 9, 1918, and Harold A. Chesley, killed at Cambrai on October 12, 1918. The last two being but boys and having taken part in the big offensive of the latter part of the war.
