This is the King Edward Memorial designed for Parliament Hill, Ottawa, by Walter S. Allward, a Canadian sculptor, and awarded first prize. The motive of the design is that of the king as peacemaker.

ADVANCE IN CLOVER SEED

Sackville Tribune—Within the last four weeks the price of medium red and mammoth clover seed of the higher grades has risen 85 per cent. This makes guaranteed No. 1 seed worth at the present time 29 to 30 cents a pound. Alsike clover is also higher, while there is a firmer feeling in regard to timothy. The rapid rise in the price of clover seed is accounted for by the requirements under the seed control act this year. So strict are the provisions for grading that comparatively little of the visible supply has passed Nos. 1 and 2 grades. No. 3 grade can be had for much lower figures, but there is no demand for it, the farmers preferring to pay more for reliable seed.

NOW SAY PRINCE ARTHUR MAY BE NEXT GOVERNOR-GENERAL

London, May 2.—There is some probability that when the Duke of Connaught returns to Canada he will be accompanied by his only son, Prince Arthur. Of the report that His Royal Highness will succeed his father as governor-general of the Dominion there is, however, no official confirmation, though it is believed that the appointment would be in accordance with the king's wishes. The fact that His Royal Highness remains a bachelor is, of course, a serious difficulty.

THE ST. JOHN REFINERY

(West India Circular, London)

Robert Anderson, honorable correspondent of the West India Committee in Montreal, is at present in this country and hopes to remain until April 26. Mr. Anderson has lately been appointed buying and sales manager to the Atlantic Sugar Refineries, Ltd., which is erecting a sugar refinery at St. John, N. B.

The first announcement that a sugar refinery was to be erected at St. John, which was made exclusively in these columns as far as this country is concerned, was received in some quarters with scepticism. Since then the Atlantic Sugar Refineries, Ltd., has been floated to carry out the undertaking. Work on the foundations of the building is now well advanced and the refinery will, it is expected, be completed by May 1 next year. The factory will be situated at the east side of the entrance to the harbor and will be capable of producing 2,500 barrels of sugar per day, while the warehouse will hold no fewer than 30,000 tons of raw sugar.
