There is from five to seven Pounds currency in the hands of our Treasurer, and about twenty Pounds to collect. I have omitted writing to you until this time, in hopes the Money might have been sent agreeably to the wishes of your Committee, and can only add that I have done all in my power to accomplish the same.
