\* As is well known, VicariatesApostolic are presided over by titular bishops, that is bishops who hold the title of some ancient diocese which has been destroyed by infidels etc. Likewise archbishops or bishops who have resigned their charges on account of ill health or old age, as well as coadjutors and auxiliaries of other bishops, and nuncios and apostolic delegates and other high officials of the Roman Court are endowed with the title of such a diocese or archdiocese. There are 97 Titular Archbishoprics and 456 Titular Bishopries, from which these titles may be selected. Of course, not all these titles are continually in use.

In addition to the 862 Episcopal Sees mentioned above, there are also 47 Bishoprics, which are totally united with some other Diocese and 6, which are administered in perpetuum by the Bishops of certain of the bishop.
