CHINA AND OTHER POWERS

DISPUTE ABOUT TAXATION

The Future Trade of Manchuria is Involved

—Restrictions Provided by the Viceroy Are Not Welcomed.

MUKDEN, Jan. 22.—The Viceroy of Mukden and the foreign consuls have been unable to reach an agreement on the opening of Mukden to foreign trade. The dispute involves the whole of Manchuria. The Viceroy declares that foreigners importing foreign goods into the province must pay a special tax. The foreign consuls declare that the payment of the viceroy demands the payment of the foreign goods into the province. The dispute is now being referred to the commercial treaty of 1903 opened up by Mukden and the consular body to recognize the rights claimed by the Chinese to levy a tax on foreign goods imported into the province. Goods imported by foreigners are not taxed in the foreign consuls' hands are subject to the tax.

CHARGES MISMANAGEMENT

OF INDIAN RESERVES

Former Government Agent Tells of Deplorable Conditions Existing in Idaho.

SALT LAKE CITY, Jan. 22.—Former Governor McConnell, of Idaho, and a former Indian commissioner, in an interview in the Herald, charges gross mismanagement of the Indian schools and arraigns the system by which young girls are taken away from their parents and sent to the Indian schools. He alleges that the teachers in the schools practice great cruelty upon their charges and that the girls are allowed to be debauched. The blame for these conditions he places upon Secretary Hitchcock, who he says he acquainted with these conditions during his tenure of office, but who pigeonholed his report. He further says that the officials of the interior department conceal the true state of affairs from them. The schools are badly overcrowded, he says, and the agents try to secure as large a per capita appropriation as possible. He claims to have seen instances where Indian boys with running tubercular sores were compelled to sleep with healthy Indians.

I. C. R. PROVIDENT FUND;

FULL TEXT OF THE ACT

Following is a copy of the bill now before parliament, entitled an Act to Establish the Intercolonial and P. E. I. Railways Employees' Provident Fund. The introductory paragraphs are omitted:

1. A fund shall be established, to be known as the Intercolonial and Prince Edward Island Railways Employees' Provident Fund, for the purpose of providing for the retirement of persons who are entitled thereto under the provisions of this act.

2. The fund shall be created by means of contributions to be made from time to time as hereinafter provided by the employees and his masters.

3. His masters shall contribute annually to the fund, out of the gross earnings of the railway, an amount not exceeding one hundred thousand dollars in such sum or sums as the governor in council from time to time determines to be necessary for the maintenance of the fund.

4. Every employee shall contribute to the fund monthly one and one-half per cent of his regular monthly salary and wages, which percentage shall be deducted by the minister each month out of the said salary and wages, and so long as he remains in the service he shall in like manner continue to contribute to the fund upon the said basis, or upon such other or new basis as is established as provided for in this act, in order to provide for the payment of allowances to be provided under this act to persons who become entitled thereto immediately or soon after the coming into force of this act, the first monthly contribution by the employees shall be three per cent, instead of one and one-half per cent.

5. The fund shall be vested in, and belong to, his majesty, who shall allow interest thereon at the rate of five per cent, per annum, which interest shall be added to, and form part of, the fund.

6. A board shall be established, consisting of five persons, of whom one shall be the general manager, who shall always, when present, be chairman of the board, and two shall be appointed from time to time by the minister from among the chief officers of the railway (one of whom shall always act as chairman in the absence of the general manager), and the remaining two shall be elected annually by the employees contributing to the fund.

7. The head office of the board shall be at Moncton, in the province of New Brunswick, where all meetings of the board shall be held.

8. The board may, subject to the approval of the minister, and to the provisions of this act, make rules and regulations for the following purposes:

(a) the government of the board, and the time when, and the manner in which, meetings of the board shall be held;

(b) the time, place and manner of holding elections for the board, and the manner in which vacancies among them shall be filled;

(c) the duties of the board, and the manner in which they shall be performed;

(d) the determination of the amount of the fund to be made or the allowance to be received in any case by any employee;

(e) the manner in which, and all conditions under which, such allowance shall be payable and payments made;

(f) the determination of the amount of the fund for the efficient operation thereof; and

(g) generally for the proper and efficient carrying out of the objects of this act.

9. The board shall from time to time, and as often as the minister requires, make written reports of its action to the minister.

10. A secretary of the board shall be appointed by the minister, and shall be paid out of the fund such salary as the minister, on the recommendation of the board, determines.

11. The secretary shall be subject to the board, and shall obey all orders and directions of the board touching his duties and the conduct of his office.

12. The fund shall be administered by the minister through the board in accordance with this act and with the rules and regulations of the board, and the board shall be subject to the minister, and shall, upon the recommendation of the board, and the approval of the minister, be subject to this act and to the rules and regulations of the board, upon being retired by the minister from service, he shall be entitled to the remainder of his life.

13. The allowance to be paid under this act shall be a monthly allowance of one and one-half per cent of the average monthly pay received by an employee for the ten years immediately preceding his retirement for each year of his service, and shall be paid monthly from the fund upon retirement for the remainder of his life.

14. In ascertaining the average monthly pay received by an employee for the said ten years, if in any month the employee did not receive an amount equal to one-half of his then regular monthly salary, such month and the amount received by him for such month shall not be included.

15. In no case shall the monthly allowance to any person who has been

23. The monthly allowance to which any person shall be entitled under this act shall not be allowable to attachment, levy or seizure by or under any legal process.

24.
