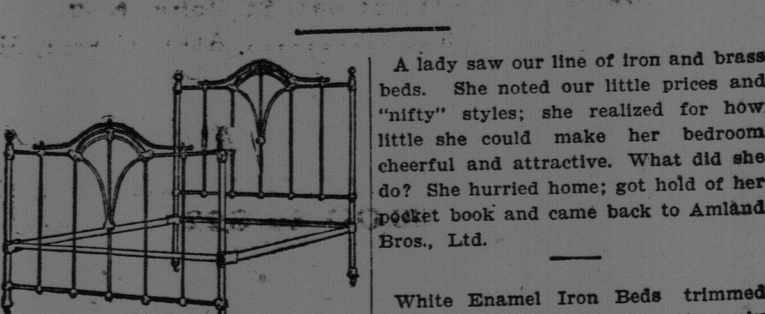

ANOTHER ROYAL WEDDING. Object is to Offset the Anglo-Spanish Marriage.

BERLIN, March 12.—Dresden court gossip is busy analyzing the underlying motives of the visit of King Frederick Augustus of Saxony to King Carlos at Labon. According to usually well informed persons, a royal match-making scheme is in progress, the prospective parties to which are the Portuguese Crown Prince, Luis Philippe, Duke of Braganza, who will be 20 on March 21, and Victoria Augusta, aged 17, the eldest daughter of Prince William of Hohenzollern. The Saxons papers do not allude to the Kaiser's hand in the plan, but the projected alliance is certainly regarded as offsetting in some degree the Anglo-Spanish marriage.
