SUNDAY TRAGEDIES.

BOSTON, Mass., Aug. 18.—Wong See Chung, the fourth victim of the Hop Sing Tong massacre, of rival tong in Boston's Chinatown three weeks ago, was buried today following unusually elaborate funeral services, attended by upwards of 3,000 Chinamen and as many more white people. The services were held in the open street of the Oriental district, off the street. The deceased was a 32nd degree member of the Chinese Masonic order.

PORTLAND, Me., Aug. 18.—Mrs. Rosie Rosenthal, 28 years of age, the proprietress of a millinery shop here, was drowned in the Presumpscot River this afternoon by the capsizing of the boat in which she, her sister, Clara Conings, of Boston and Hyman Sivovolos were rowing. Miss Conings and Sivovolos reached the shore but Mrs. Rosenthal never came to the surface after sinking.
