The date fixed is Sept. 10, and the dinner will be given at the Chateau Laurier Hotel. The Prime Minister will be the guest of honor and the other Cabinet Ministers will also be present as guests. Preparations are actively on foot to make the dinner, which will be a demonstration of loyalty to Mr. Borden and an expression of satisfaction at the manner in which he has represented Canada in the councils of the Empire, an occasion of unusual brilliancy.

WHEREAS it is desirable to discontinue that portion of the north eastern side of Nelson Street, in the City of St. John, described as follows, that is to say:

West Side, in Guy's Ward, in the City of St. John, on the western side of the Harbor which lies North of a line described as follows: beginning on the Eastern side of Nelson Street at the intersection thereof with the line of division between lot "B" and lot sixteen (16); the said point of intersection being at a distance of two hundred and seventy-eight (278) feet more or less, measured along the said line of said Street from the intersection thereof with the northern line of Cross Street, as shown on the plan of Fort Neck prepared by Thomas O'Keefe, and bearing date September 18th A. ## SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH-WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a household and who has been a resident of a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. The applicant must appear in person at the agency for the district, or by proxy, must be accompanied by father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister, or intending homesteader.

Duration—Six months residence upon cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within one mile of his homestead on a farm of at least 50 acres solely owned and occupied by him or his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may pre-empt a quarter-section alongside his homestead. Price \$10.00 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or pre-emption site monthly in each year of settlement for a period of three years, including the time required to earn money to pay the purchase price of the land.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased leasehold in certain districts. Price \$25.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside on the land for each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$100.00.
