London, Jan. 29.—A British official communication issued this evening concerning, the fighting on the Irak front in Asiatic Turkey says:

"As the result of operations caturday night and Sunday we are now in complete possession of Turkish first and second lines southwest of Kutel-Amara, on the right bank of the Tigris on a front of 4,300 yards. We also hold the enemy's third and fourth lines on a frontage of 600 yards.
