**WANT A SAY IN
FINAL TERMS**

Small Nations Demand Terms
Affecting Them be Sub-
mitted to People Affected.

New York, Dec. 16.—A demand that
any agreement reached by the peace
conference affecting any nationality
be submitted to a plebiscite of that
nationality for approval or rejection,
was contained in a cablegram sent to
President Wilson in Paris tonight by
the second annual council of the
league of small and sub-nation-
alities.

While the cablegram was addressed
to President Wilson, it was said
scarcely of it would be sent to the
premiers of England, France and
Italy.

Delegates at the convention includ-
ed representatives from Albania, As-
siria, Greece, India, Ireland, Korea,
Lettonia, Lithuania, Persia, Poland,
Scotland, Ukraine and the Transvaal.
