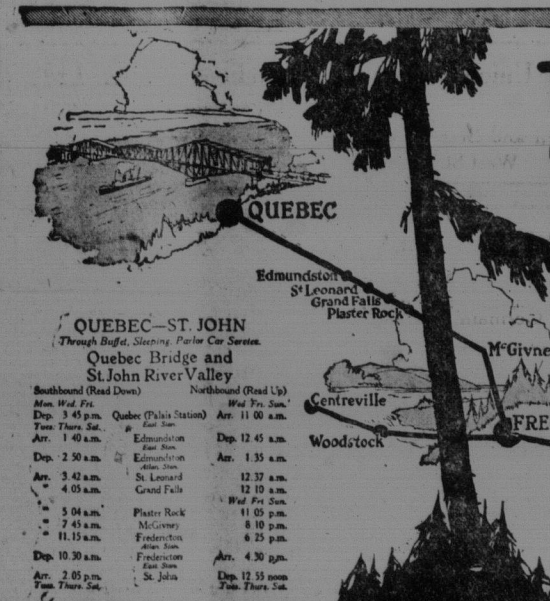

Drowned in Bay of Fundy.
Six women who were passengers on the schooner T. W. Allen when she foundered in the Bay of Fundy, off Harbottle, N. S., last month, lost their lives, together with Captain Silva and his crew of seven. The names of the women are: Laura Silva and Gertrude Gonzales, both of Provincetown, Mass.; Julia Andrews, Bertha Gomes, Jane Andrews and Marnet Rogers, all of New Bedford. The schooner was bound from New Bedford for the Cape De Verde Islands.

Ellis Island's Longest Visitor DEPORTED TUES.

Has Been Detained as Undesirable Since the Beginning of War.

New York, Jan. 13.—Ellis Island's most protracted visitor Migl Cogie, who has been detained there since August 3, 1914, is his way home to Austria, immigration authorities reported today. Cogie, who received the Soubriquet of "cognac al" arrived here upon the outbreak of the war but was found to have defective vision and was ordered deported as an undesirable alien.

War caused a suspension of sailing to Austria, and he was forced to wait until conditions became normal. His board cost the government \$2,046, according to immigration officials, and in addition he took away with him \$485 earned during hair cutting, shaving and tailoring for immigrants. Cogie was 48 years of age when he arrived here in 1914.
