

### BLACK AND TANS ATTACKED WHILE IN DUBLIN CITY

#### Heavy Firing for Short Time in Cork, But Conditions Are Quiet Usually.

Dublin, Dec. 14.—A party of armed men attacked a military lorry carrying six Black and Tans at Ballsbridge on the outskirts of this city this morning. The Black and Tans took cover in the post office. Shots fired were rushed up and relieved them. The casualties, if any, had not been reported up to this afternoon.

Cork, Dec. 14.—Except for a heavy fusillade of rifle shots at about one o'clock this morning, which aroused the population of Cork, frightened by the conflagration and disorders of Saturday and Sunday, the night passed quietly in the city. No police auxiliaries were in evidence in the streets today, and it is believed all have left the city. Many of the shopkeepers, refusing to accept the assurances of the military that order would be maintained, are closing their stores and departing, causing a further increase of unemployment.

### BODY OF MURDERED WOMAN IS FOUND

#### Ship in New York Port Brings Mutilated Remains to the Surface.

New York, Dec. 14.—A woman's torso was found in New York Bay, off Staten Island, yesterday. The police found no marks on the torso to aid in identification. They expressed belief it had been in the water a long time. Investigators say the woman was murdered, as the bare marks of having been cut by a sharp instrument such as a knife. They declared it was impossible for arms, legs and head all to have been washed off by the propeller of some harbor craft. Police records show no report of a woman missing from Staten Island within a week. The authorities are working on the theory that she may have been slain either in New York City or along the Jersey shore and her body tossed into the water.

### STILL DISCUSSING DESIGN FOR GREAT TRIBUTE TO LAURIER

Ottawa, Dec. 14.—The final selection of a design for the memorial to be erected to the memory of the late Sir Wilfrid Laurier by Canadian Liberals had not yet been made by the committee of the National Liberal convention, who have the matter in hand. Most of the designs which were put before the committee, the chief of which has narrowed down to about half a dozen and further particulars as to these designs is being awaited by the committee before the final decision is made.
