  - b. Evening Classes.

## RELIGIOUS

A well conducted Bible Class, and weekly religious meetings at the rooms.

Weekly meetings at the Jail and Hospital, and at Mount Sherwood, Stewarton and other places when possible.

## GENERAL.

A register of boarding houses is kept. Assistance is afforded in securing employment. Every attention in the Association's power is shown to the young men. The Secretary will be glad to be made aware of cases of young men in sickness. When possible, watchers will be provided.
