## World champ Dynes here

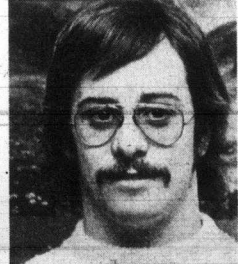

## Three Missy men are world ranked

Two of Canada's 57 world-ranked athletes in Olympic events are from Mississauga. "A" card carriers are those who place in the top eight, or top third of competitors in world events. Those ranking 9th to 16th, or in the top half of world event competitors are in the "B" category. Game Plan 76 also recognized canoeing coach Mac Hickox, of the Mississauga Canoe Club, in its list of top ranking coaches. McDonald, 23, a post-graduate student from the

University of Michigan, won the silver medal in the 100m butterfly at the Commonwealth Games in Christchurch, New Zealand in February. "Monsieur Butterfly" was beaten in a photo finish by Australia's Neil Rogers by 25-100th of a second. Paddler Wood, 24, of Port Credit recently captured the 1,000 meter Canadian canoe race in international competition in Ottawa.

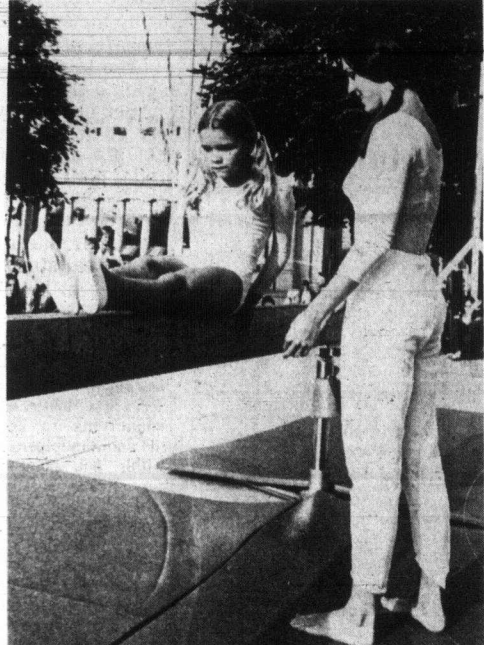
