"Ottawa, 14th February 1913.

Sir,-

I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 6th instant No.9616-10814, and to inform you that the plot of the land required by the Canadian Northern Ontario railway in lots 11 and 12, Con. 2, Benucage, Nipissing Indian reserve, Ontario, contains according to the plan filed 23.76 acres. The value placed upon this land by our Indian Agent is \$20.00 per acre; the sum due is therefore \$475.20.

Before concluding this transaction I have to request you to be good enough to reply to a letter to Mr.W.W.Evans of your Department informing him that the block of land in question includes at its northern and a part of a lot of land which was laid out for a mill site and requesting him to state for what purpose the land is required. Kindly explain this point as it is desired to retain the said land for a mill site to afford facility the for developing water power thereon.
