## SUMMARY OF EVIDENCE

in the case of

G-44733 Spr Charles Lewis STANLEY, RCE on strength No 7 Cdn Artizan Works Coy RCE a soldier of the Canadian Army Overseas.

By direction of the Commanding Officer this summary of Evidence is taken on oath:

FIRST WITNESS FOR THE PROSECUTION A-20335 CQMS W T Naylor, quartermaster of No 7 Cdn Artizan Works Coy RCE having been duly aworn states:

I, A-20335 CQMS Naylor W T was informed on the morning of the 8 AUG 48 that cigarettes had been stolen from House 18 in the unit lines, and that a guard had been posted when the cigarettes were localing a cupboard. At approx 1645 hrs 8 AUG 46 acting located in a cupboard. At approx 1645 hrs 8 AUG 46 a upon instructions I contacted S/Sgt Miller of the SIS and made an appointment for 1800 hrs. Acting upon information received with QNS Weir at approx 1745 hrs requisitioned transport and proceeded to locate Spr Stanley. could not find him in Bordon, but did meet S/Sgt MILLER, and returned to the unit in the Provost car-We picked up L/Opl Atkinson and also an address at which we were likely to find Spr Stanley. We proceeded to Stanford Hill to the home of a friend of S pr Stanley, and upon inquiring found that he was not there, so we waited for the bus from Bordon, (). request Spr Stanley got into the car and was driven back to 7 CAWC, RCE HQ. After questioning him for about an hour, he was searched by S/Sgt Miller in the presence of QMS Weir and myself. The search produced 2 packets of eigarettes, that were marked similar to the eigarettes that S/Sgt MILLER then produced from S/Sgt cache of eigarettes in the cupboard. Miller then cautioned Spr Stanley and took him to Provost HQ for further questioning.

The Accused declines to cross-examine this witness.

SECOND WITNESS for the PROSECUTION L-101099 Sgt Satterlee T S on strength No 7 Cdn Artizan Works Coy RCE having been duly sworn states:

I am Sgt i/c heavy equipment and operators S.E.E. for 7 CAW Goy at Guadaloupe Barracks Bordon. At approx 1700 hrs 7 AUG 46 just after finishing work Spr Stanley and I went to our quarters at House 18 Guadaloupe barracks. As we entered the house Spr Stanley drew my attention to the front door being open which he said he had closed going out. As we waiked through his room Spr Stanley then drew my attention to the fact that the screws in the hasplock of his cupboard had been taken out. I immediately went upstairs to check the other rooms and seemingly they were O.K. I didn't think any more about it until a few minutes after the boys came in from work when both L/Cpl Atkinson and Spr Fierce reported the loss of their cigarettes from their cupboards which had been left locked. It appeared that the cigarettes had been taken by prying open the top of the doors. As it should have been noticed if anybody had carried out about 1500 cigarettes I figured that they
