

being really of no particular use to anyone. He recommended the granting of five acres -- it would never be interfered with -- this five acre reserve to be on the northern shore of Simoon Sound, on a small bay lying between Timber Limit No. 27516 and Timber Limit No. 27522. As to the application for Kukwaps (Insect Island and the small islands adjacent) land could not be taken away from Insect Island without interfering with the Timber Limit by which it was covered. He recommended, however, that Fly Island be granted, that island being to the northwest of Insect Island and also a part of the Benjamin Group, as well as the two small islands immediately north of it, about 80 acres being contained in all three of these islands, which contained some scrubby timber but little of merchantable growth. The application for Guayasams was not recommended, as all the land affected was under timber limit; nor could the application for Walak be endorsed, although these Indians had no fishing station whatever. As to the application for additional land for graveyard purposes: This special application was for land opposite Quayee Reserve which had been cleared by the Pulp Company and was ready for immediate use. These Indians now buried their dead on the Reserve lands and they wanted this new burying ground because it was cleared and they would thus be saved some trouble. If their application were to be granted it would shut off all frontage from Lot No. 148, for which reason he declined to endorse the application.

To deal with the applications of the Gilford Island Tribe (Tsch-waw-ti-nouch, Ah-kwaw-ah-mish and Kwaw-wimuk Bands): That for Atlatiku (01) was not approved. That for Kyidaggins (02) was for land apparently open, and he recommended that eighty acres be granted, 20 chains back and forty chains along the beach, which would give all the facilities for canoe building that would be required for many years to come. The land recommended to be granted
