The trains run almost alongside of the Steamer dock, passengers' baggage checked through to destination. This route is the natural connection to all points in Canada.

Through the Garden of Canada to Niagara-on-the-Lake. From the Union Depot in Buffalo, the Michigan Central R. R. passes through Black Rock and over the celebrated "International Bridge" to the Canadian side, Falls View Station, where all trains stop five minutes to allow passengers

to enjoy this sublime sight, said to be the *ideal spot from* which to view the Falls.

Victoria Park is owned by the Canadian Government, and is directly below Falls View Station, one of the most delightful spots on earth,

where all points are good ones to view Niagara.

Niagara Falls, Canada, is the point where the Michigan Central R. R. starts West to points in Canada, Detroit, Chicago, etc.

Gradually down the side of the mountain the train descends, and from the car windows may be seen what is justly styled "The Fruit Garden of America."

A short run further down the river side, brings us beneath the Monument of General Brock, whose war history is so well known, passing by the Camp
