

- A. It is the expressed juice of apples.
- Q. Does cider always contain alcohol?
- A. It does, after fermentation has begun.
- Q. How soon does fermentation begin?
- A. In some cases it begins probably immediately after, or very soon after the juice is expressed.
- Q. Will cider then intoxicate?
- A. It will.
- Q. Then the only safe rule is not to drink cider at all?
- A. Yes.
- Q. Can you give any other reason why we should abstain from drinking cider?
- A. It is written: "It is good neither to eat flesh nor to drink wine, *nor anything* whereby thy brother stumbleth, or is offended, or is made weak."
- Q. Mention some other fruits the fermented juice of which is intoxicating?
- A. Grapes, pears, peaches and currants.
- Q. What is sometimes added to the juice of fruits to hasten fermentation?
- A. Sugar.
