COTSWOLD. A country post office in
Minto township, Wellington County, 36
miles north-west of Guelph, the county seat,
and 5 north-east of Palmerston, on the W G
and B line G W div G T Ry, its nearest
railway point. Nearest bank at Harriston.
Settled in 1865. It contains Disciples' and
Presbyterian churches and common school,
and ships produce. Population, 25. Mail
daily. Wm Smith, postmaster.

COTTAM. A village in Gosfield town-
ship, Essex County, 22 miles south-east of
Sandwich, the county seat, and 5 south-east
of Essex Centre, on the C div MCCR, its
nearest railway and banking point. Settled
in 1859. It contains a town hall, Methodist
church and public school, and ships live stock,
grain and lumber. Stages daily to Leaming-
ton, Ruthven, Olinda, Kingsville, Cottam
and Essex Centre. Population, 300. Mail
daily. Wm E Wagstaff, postmaster.

and 10 west of Orillia, the nearest railway
and banking point. Settled in 1845. It
contains Methodist and Presbyterian
churches and common school, and ships
lumber, shingles and grain, Stage daily to
Orillia. Population, 50. Mail daily. Wm.
Walker, postmaster.

COURTICE. A flourishing village in
a good locality midway between Bowman-

has telephone communication. It contains
a Methodist church and a common school,
and ships cheese and produce. Stage tri-
weekly to Bowmanville. Population, 100.
Mail tri-weekly. C W Lent, postmaster.
