WHAT SHE COULD DO

A poor old woman in China, who had been converted, but who seemed unwilling to be baptized was asked why she hesitated. "Why," she replied, with the tears running down her cheeks, "you know that Jesus said to his disciples: 'Go ye into all the world and preach the gospel to every creature.' Now, I am an old woman nearly seventy years of age, and almost blind. I can tell my husband about Jesus Christ, and I can tell my son, and his wife when he has one; I am willing to speak to my neighbours and perhaps I can go to one or two villages, but I can never go to all the world. Now, do you think he will let me call myself a disciple, if I can do no better than that?"

When she heard that the Lord asked only for the best from each of His followers, and does not require from any one more than he can do, she said gladly: "Oh, then I am ready to be baptized whenever you think best." If all the baptized disciples of the Lord were conscientious in their reading of His words as was this poor old woman, certainly there would be no lack of missionaries.—*Selected.*

In the forward movement initiated by the Church Missionary Society over seven years ago, that Society has furnished an object lesson of what faith, under God, when supported by courage, can accomplish. During this period no suitable candidates, no qualified missionaries have been refused on financial grounds; the consequence has been that the number of missionaries, exclusive of wives, has increased from 333 to 634, and the number of single lady missionaries from 32 to 193, while the receipts last year exceed by more than £20,000 those of any former year.—*Missionary Review.*
