Mr. M. Nider took the chair of the Committee;

Mr. Speaker relumed the chair.

And Mr. M'Nider reported, that the Committee had gone through the Bill and had made some amendments thereto, which he was directed to report to the House, whenever it should be pleased to receive the same.

Ordered, that the report be received to morrow.

And on motion of Mr. Bedard, feconded by Mr. Digé,

The House adjourned till to-morrow at three o'clock in the afternoon.

Mr. McNider, according to order, reported from the Committee of the whole House, to whom the Bill for the appointment of Inspectors to ascertain the quality of Pot and Pearl ashes for exportation, was committed; the amendments which the Committee had made to the Bill; and which they had directed him to report to the House: and he read the report in his place; and afterwards delivered the Bill, with the amendments, in at the Clerk's table; where the amendments were again read once throughout, and then a second time, one by one; and, upon the question severally put thereupon, were agreed to by the House.

On motion of Mr. Richardson, seconded by Mr. Lees, Ordered, that the Bill with the amendments be ingrossed.
