CANADIAN AFFAIRS.

FROM OUR OWN CORRESPONDENT. Toronto, October 5, 1850. The effect of the Fugitive Slave Bill, which has just gone into operation in the United States, to pursue and capture them in any part of the Union, has already been to be felt along the Canadian frontier.

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LONDON, September 31, 1850. I presume it is for the want of a better subject that the Metropolitan and Provincial Press, during the last few days, have devoted so small space to a discussion on the treatment which General Haynes received a fortnight since, at the hands of Messrs. Barclay and Perkins' draymen.

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The object of the Bill, which the Ministry introduced on the 1st of September, is more complimentary to their ingenuity than their honesty. They made up their minds to advance not to the rights of their official enemies, unless they were wrenched from them, and though they yielded that deference to public opinion, which constituted them to travel through the form of an investigation—they were nearly unanimous in their hostility to any reform, and resolved, if possible, to headwind the Colony. There was one member of the Cabinet, and only one, who rendered his private interests for the sake of a public good—the Hon. Mr. Mackenzie.
