o'clock.

the Saturday previous to the Show.

Heifers in calf, or giving milk, not to be debarred
from competition, if under three years old.

A like amount of Premiums, will be offered for
competition in King's County, at Finlay's Cross
Roads, and in Prince County, at St. Elmer's, the
time to be determined by the local Committees.
