Right for Aylesworth.—Indecent for Fitzpatrick.
Sessional Indemnities Fully Discussed at Last.

A Daring Hold-up and Swindle.

A Government which Suppresses Facts by Garbling Reports and Falsifying Public Documents.

OTTAWA, MAY 12.

On Monday of this week the House by a straight party majority of forty-five, rejected the motion of Mr. Lennox, "That it is inexpedient that any member of the Government or deputy head of a department, should act or appear as barrister, counsel or advocate in any action, suit or proceeding, except where the interests of the crown are involved, in any court presided over by a judge appointed by the Government of Canada."

Hon. A. B. Aylesworth, Postmaster General, who has conducted several cases in court since he took office, declared in the House that he has a right to do so. The Minister of Justice pleaded for his colleague, and the Premier spoke briefly in defence.

AYLESWORTH'S DEFENCE.

These things do not move Mr. Aylesworth. With almost hysterical eloquence he denounced members who suggested that judges could be influenced by fear or favor. "I cry shame upon such an argument, shame that it should ever have been heard in the Legislative Hall of this or any country," he shouted.

ANOTHER MINISTER'S SENSE.

While the Minister of Justice did not condemn his colleague, he had this different statement to make for himself. "I say it would be indecent in the last degree, if I were to go into the courts and practise there, and the very minute I became Minister of Justice I ceased to practise."

THE JEWEL OF INCONSISTENCY.

In voting down the Lennox resolution, the House adopted an amendment moved by Mr. Fitzpatrick, that "Public business should have the first claim on the time and attention of every member of the government," and permanent officials should give to their duties their whole time and attention.

SALARIES, ANNUITIES AND INDEMNITIES.

The motion of the second reading of the bill concerning annuities to former Ministers, and indemnities to Senators and members of the Commons, was defeated on Wednesday by a vote of a hundred and sixty-seven to nine. This was a bill repealing the legislation of last year.

ALLOWANCE TO OPPOSITION LEADER.

The large increase to the Premier's salary was hardly mentioned. The salary of the Leader of the Opposition seems to be generally regarded here as a fair return for public work thrust upon him, and a step in the general public interest.

SESSIONAL INDEMNITIES.

For the first time parliament had a fair and public discussion of the question of sessional indemnity, or as Mr. Bourassa thinks it should be called, the salary of members of parliament. In the first place it has been shown that there is not an increase of a thousand dollars a year.

WESTERN LAND SCANDALS.

Mr. Ames, the member for the St. Antoine division of Montreal, gives his whole time to public service. That he works for good purpose was shown in the discussion which he introduced on Thursday.

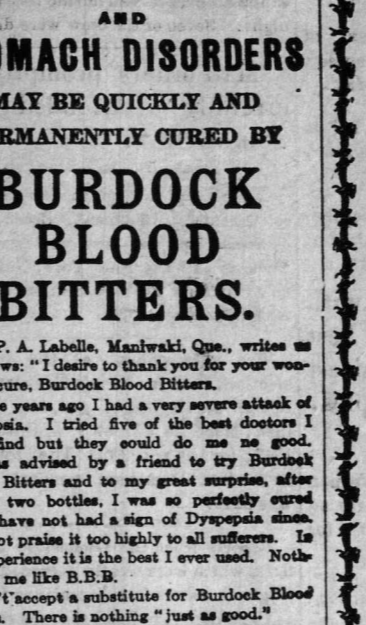
