THE NEWFOUNDLAND ARRIVES AT HALIFAX. HALIFAX, N.S., March 10.

Emperor William died yesterday morning at half-past 8 o'clock. The general conviction prevails that there will be no change in the policy of the Empire while Prince Bismarck lives. The new Emperor assumes the title of Frederick the Third. Emperor Frederick leaves San Remo to-day. The Reichstag has adjourned indefinitely. The last act of the Emperor was to sign the decree closing the session. The Emperor died holding the Empress by the hand. His last words were: -" I am a man of peace, but if Russia forces me to war, I shall faithfully side with my ally, Austria. Alexander promised me not to make war against us. I am convinced he ought not to make war against Austria, towards whom a most friendly attitude ought to be maintained." Queen Victoria and the Prince of Wales are in deep mourning, and court mourning for a month has been ordered. The Prince of Wales, Prince Christian and Prince Henry of Battenburg will represent Queen Victoria at the funeral
