THE DEAD EMPEROR.

His Last Words to the Empress.

FREDERICK LEAVES SAN REMO.

Preparations for the Funeral.

THE NEWFOUNDLAND ARRIVES AT HALIFAX.

HALIFAX, N.S., March 10.

Emperor William died yesterday morning at half-past 8 o'clock. The general conviction prevails that there will be no change in the policy of the Empire while Prince Bismarck lives. The new Emperor assumes the title of Frederick the Third. Emperor Frederick leaves San Remo to-day. The Reichstag has adjourned indefinitely. The last act of the Emperor was to sign the decree closing the session. The Emperor died holding the Empress by the hand. His last words were:—"I am a man of peace, but if Russia forces me to war, I shall faithfully side with my ally, Austria. Alexander promised me not to make war against us. I am convinced he ought not to make war against Austria, towards whom a most friendly attitude ought to be maintained." Queen Victoria and the Prince of Wales are in deep mourning, and court mourning for a month has been ordered. The Prince of Wales, Prince Christian and Prince Henry of Battenberg will represent Queen Victoria at the funeral.

The steamer Newfoundland arrived here yesterday.

EFFECT OF THE EMPEROR'S DEATH.

All Classes of the People Mourning.

BERLIN, This Forenoon.

The death of the venerable Emperor yesterday morning has had a wonderful effect on his loyal and affectionate subjects. It is evident now that they loved him sincerely. All classes mourn for him, and traces of sorrow are visible everywhere. Prince Frederick, who has been proclaimed Emperor, is now on his way from San Remo.

Leaving for the Icefields.

FOUR DAYS' GOOD FISHING.

CHANNEL, This Afternoon.

FROM CAPE BROYLE.

A Bumper Trip of Halibut.

CAPE BROYLE, This Afternoon.

Capt Currie, in the barque Meteor, arrived at Aquaforte, reports speaking to Capt. Renie, of the banking schooner Minnesota, from Gloucester, in lat. 44.08 N., lon. 52.41 W. The Minnesota had on board a bumper trip of halibut, and was bound home.

General Northern Despatches.

Fogo, This Forenoon.

A moderate breeze is blowing from E.N.E. to-day, and the heavy sea continues. There is now no sign of seals in any direction.

GREENSPOND, This Forenoon.

Wind northeast, blowing a light breeze and the Bay packed with ice. There seems no chance of the steamers getting out yet. Barometer 30.30.

TWILLINGATE, This Forenoon.

A very light breeze prevails to-day from E.N.E., and the weather is frosty. No seals are reported.

BONAVISTA, This Afternoon.

Wind northeast, blowing hard, but mild and dull. The Bay is now full of ice.

CAPE RACE, This Evening.

A light breeze from E.N.E., prevails here to-day, but the weather continues fine. A few small strings of ice are in sight drifting west.
