Insect Bite Prevents Kaiser from Signing State Documents.

Special to Evening Telegram. BERLIN, May 29. Emperor William is experiencing some inconvenience because of an eruption of the right hand, caused by the bite of an insect. The Court physicians state that there is no danger of serious consequences from the irritation which they expect will disappear in a few days. They have however, opened and treated the affected part against the possible development of blood poisoning. For the time being His Majesty has delegated the signature of State documents to Crown Prince Frederick William, and all urgent decrees will appear with the double signature of the Crown Prince and the Imperial Chancellor, preceded by the words "By order of the Emperor." This is the first occasion during the reign of the Emperor upon which the documents of state have received other than His Majesty's autograph.

Women's Suffrage Bill.

Special to the Evening Telegram. LONDON, May 29. A number of members of Parliament of all parties have constituted themselves a committee for women suffrage. They are settling the question on a plan acceptable to all shades of suffrage. As a practical minimum they will introduce in the House of Commons as early as possible a bill enfranchising women holding such house property as would qualify them if they were men to vote. The promoters of the bill regard it merely as a working compromise, not as an ideal solution. It would add a million new voters to the register. The committee contends that the present House of Commons, like all since 1870, shows a majority in favor of women suffrage.

The Maggie and May Affair.

Mr. Philip English, of Job's Cove, whose son, Patrick Edward English, was drowned two years ago on the schooner Maggie & May in collision with the German cruiser Freya, arrived here a couple of days ago to interview U. S. Consul Benedict on the matter. Mr. English says that his son had been fishing from Gloucester for 12 years when he was drowned. He was a sober steady chap, and saved about \$1,500 which is still in Bank at Gloucester. Mr. English says that as far as he can learn the sum of \$2,700 has been awarded the relatives of the drowned men by the German Government, and it is to recover this and his son's private savings now at Gloucester that he came here to see the Consul. The Telegram had a wire on Saturday from Rev. J. Lynch, of Northern Bay, establishing the identity of the drowned fisherman.

When the accident occurred the schooner was bound to Halifax from Gloucester to complete her crew.
