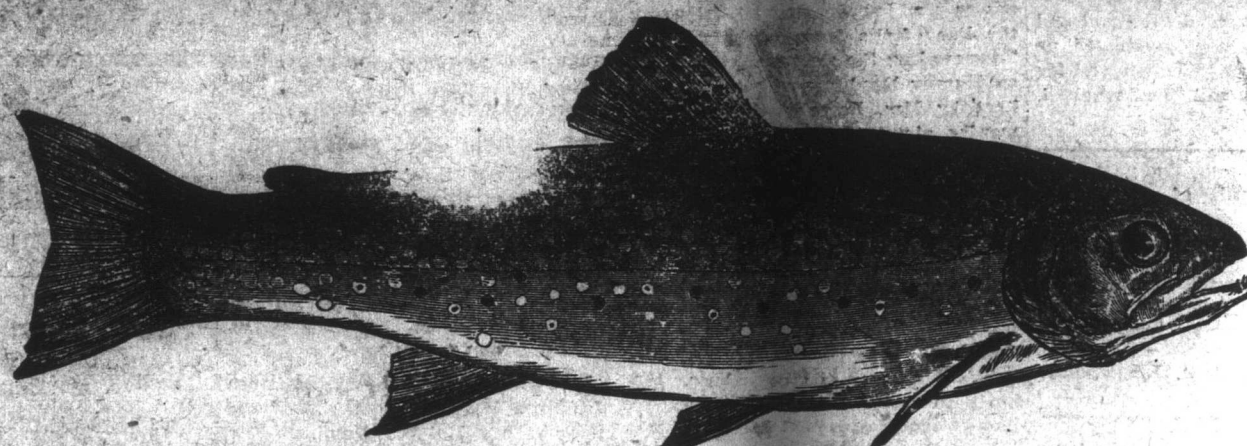

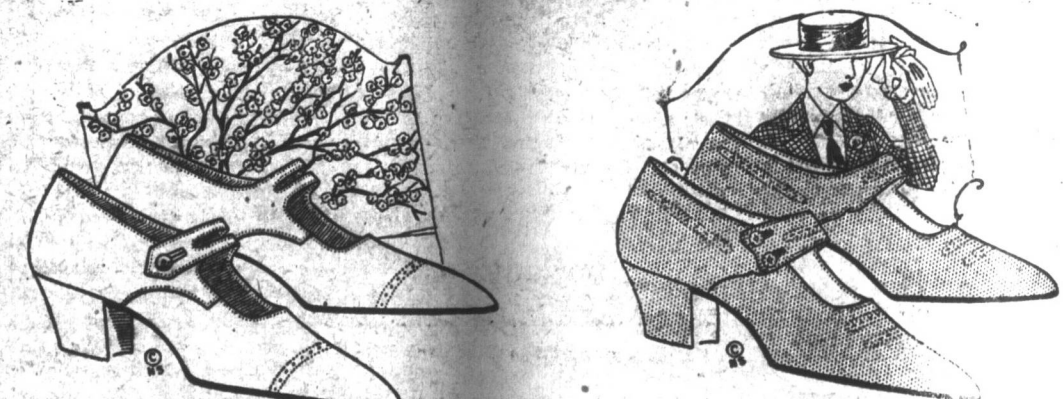

The everyday vegetables will seem more appetizing if cut in interesting shapes with a vegetable cutter.

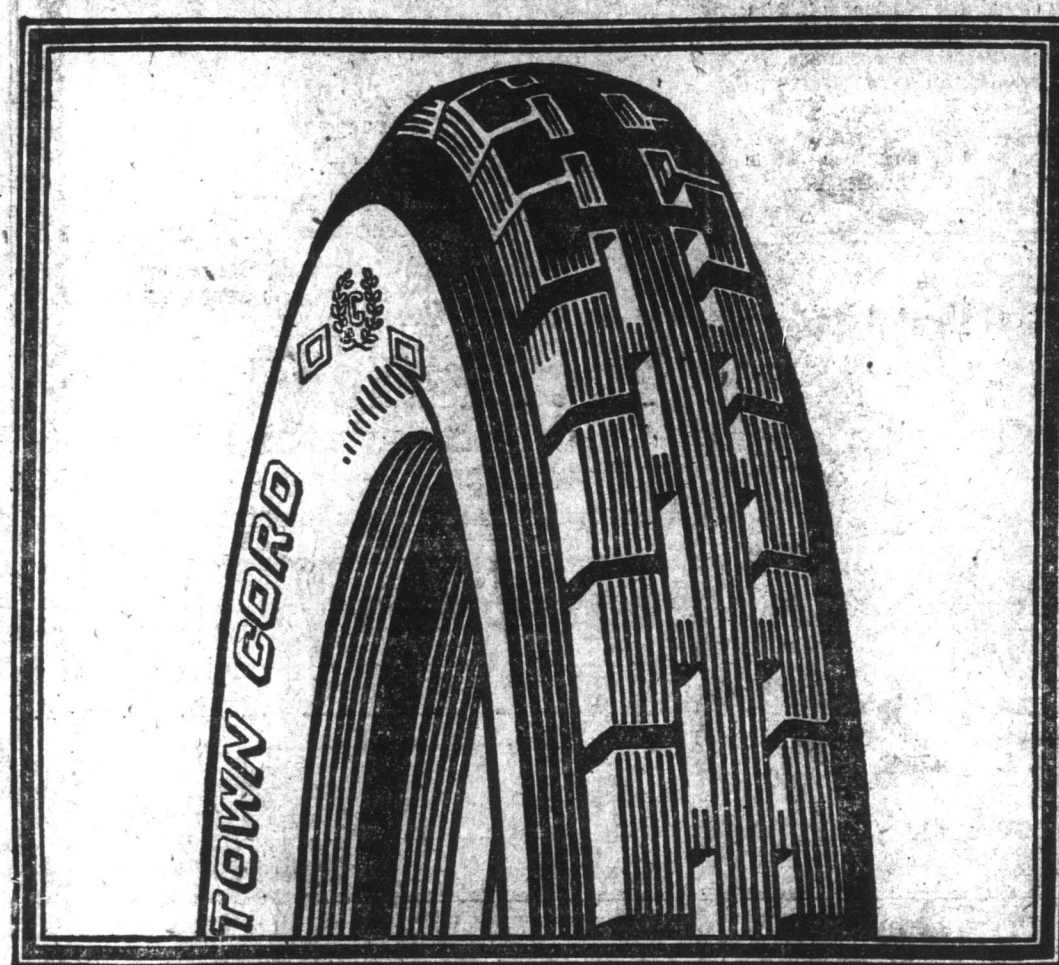
To remove an iodine stain from white cotton, boil it in soap and water to which a little turpentine has been added.
