**AMALGAMATION OF LONDON WEST.**  
Ald. J. W. Jones reported for the committee appointed to consider the London West amalgamation bill. The committee recommended that the bill be amended so that the annexed portion shall be assessed on the same basis as the remainder of the city. Passed.

If the clause in the report regarding the assessment was adopted it would only be unnecessary expense to the city to have the matter submitted to the Legislature. The recent flood had placed the village in a less favorable light.

The members of the council were of the opinion that the village should be assessed on the same basis as the remainder of the city. The matter was referred to the committee.

## "NOTHING IN IT."

Chicago Orangemen Take No Stock in the Talk of an Ulster Uprising.  
CHICAGO, March 30.—Chicago Orangemen do not take much stock in the report of a threatened uprising of Orangemen in Ulster in case the Home Rule Bill is passed. "I don't believe a word of it," said B. P. Reynolds, grand master of the Loyal Orange Lodge, to a reporter the other day.

"These reports and rumors circulated for the past month are absurd. There is no arming, no collecting of money, at least on our side. If there were, the Orangemen here would know of it. I believe that these reports are spread by the other side. The men of Ulster are quiet and peaceable. If the bill becomes a law it will not be in the province of the Orangemen to rebel against an act of Parliament. The talk of the Orangemen of Canada helping the men in the old country is likewise absurd. There is nothing in it."
