## TOUCHED 60,000 VOLTS.

Syracuse, Aug. 9.—Frederick Souers  
came in contact with a wire carrying  
60,000 volts of electricity at the sub-  
station of the Niagara, Lockport and  
Ontario Power Company, near this  
city, this morning. There was a re-  
port like that from a gun and a flash  
of fire from his body as he fell life-  
less to the ground from the top of a  
20-foot ladder. Flames shot from the  
man's body for several minutes before  
they were extinguished with water.  
The body was horribly burned. Souers  
was 30 years old and married.
