EX-SHAH LOSES IN HEAVY FIGHTING

Ali Mirza's Force Repulsed by the Persian Government Troops.

Teheran, Persia, Aug. 30.—Heavy fighting has occurred at Fereydun, Deh-mayend and Savadkuk, towns to the west of Teheran and not far distant from the capital. The forces of the ex-Shah Mohammed Ali Mirza stormed the city of Fereydun, but were repulsed.
