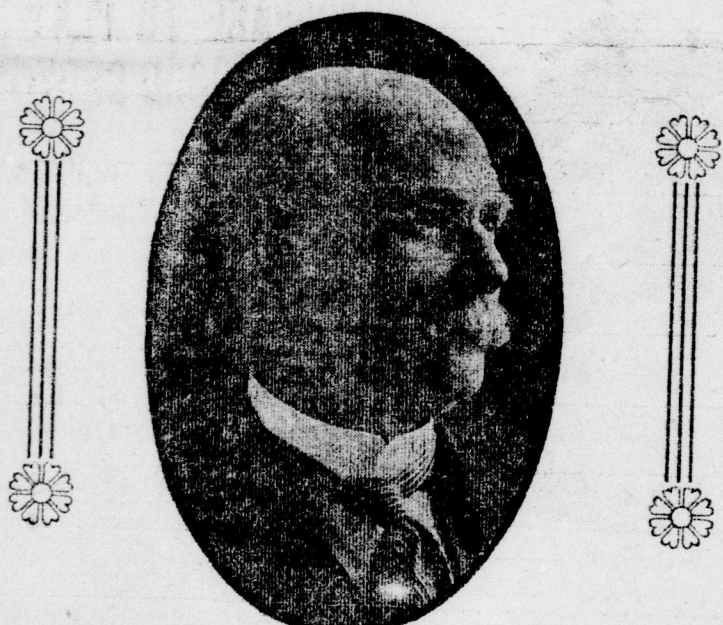

TO THE ELECTORS AND RATEPAYERS:



I stand for lower taxes without increased assessments on these... The cost of our garbage collecting system was to begin with \$2,688 a month, or \$32,256 a year. Under the improved system in October last, we gained \$524.16 the first month, making a total cost of \$25,968 a year, providing the cost has not decreased since starting. I figure that we can realize \$72,000 a year from the garbage system by the following plan:

If there are 10,000 houses in this city, and according to my figures, if each house produces on the average one-half pound of meat scraps and other material of a fatty nature per day, for which we can realize \$80 per ton or \$200 per day, without any extra cost to the city, with the exception of providing the house-holders with a small can for accumulating the scraps, at a cost of \$1.250 for 10,000 cans, and a probable additional \$2,000 a year in wages at the garbage plant.

My plan is feasible, in the fact that in New York City there is a private concern that pays, according to the information I can gather, \$250,000 a year for the privilege of collecting the garbage. In Detroit, also, a private concern pays the city for the same privilege. In the city of Glasgow they have a revenue of \$150,000 per year, and in London, England, the cost of the garbage system was reduced to a nominal expense by this method. Why not here? This is one of the planks of my platform. I solicit your vote and influence for alderman.

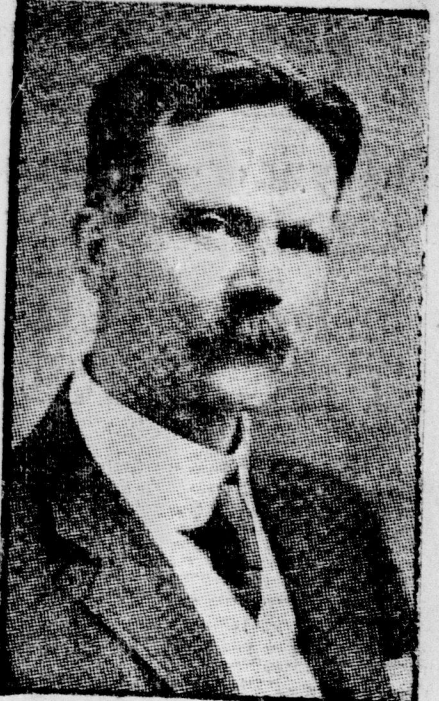

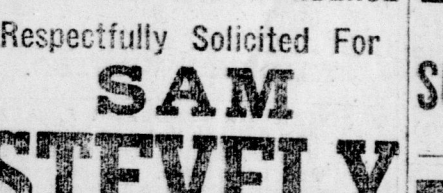
