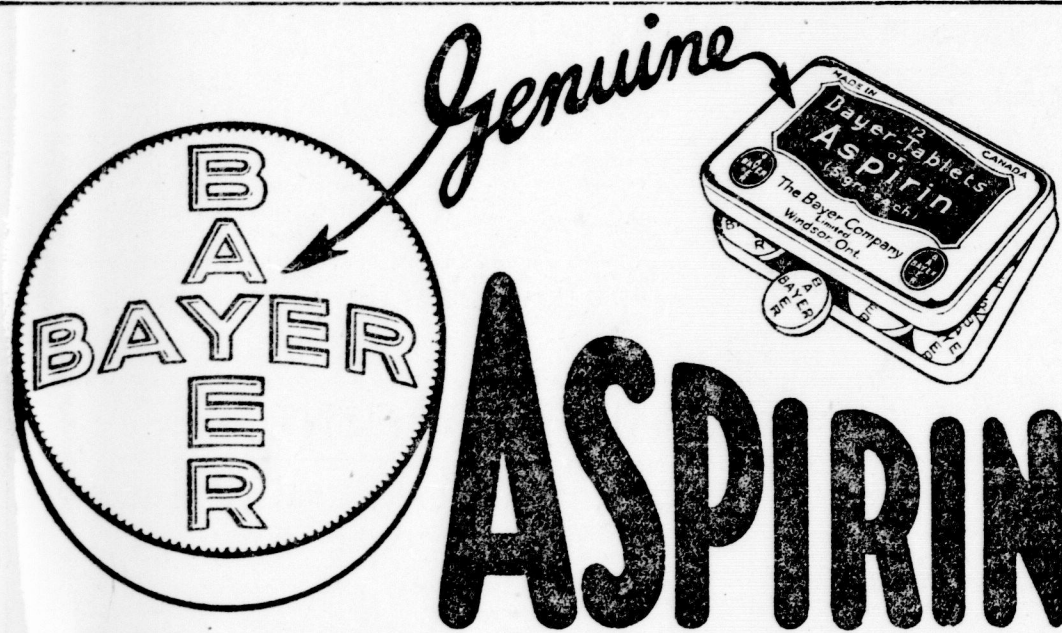

BILLY SUNDAY FLAYS EVIL IN MOVIE COLONY

Deplores Righteous Disgust Arbuckle and Taylor "Incidents" Arouse.

URGES HIGHER STANDARD

Demands Ban On Undesirable Pictures As Well As Actors and Actresses.

"I THINK the exhibition of a certain type of moving picture is the severest indictment that can be brought against the silver screen in Canada today.

"And I do not doubt that constant work on such pictures is in part responsible for alleged looseness in the lives of a few of the inhabitants of Hollywood—that goal of a million foolish dreams, and subsequently quite often the G-Word."

"There is no excuse for the exhibition of any picture which cannot be seen and enjoyed, and, best of all—understood by a boy or girl of seven. And there is still less excuse for the 'picture colony' to permit the presence there longer of the two-score vulgarities who bring discredit and unfavorable publicity by their actions to decent residents of California's movie Mecca.

Condemns "Jamborees."

"I condemn the 'Fatty' Arbuckle jamboree from start to finish, but judging from the evidence published by the newspapers at two trials on a charge of manslaughter, I do not see how he could be convicted on that charge, no matter what other crime he might be guilty of.

"Regardless of the outcome of the case, however, Arbuckle has suffered severe punishment in his fall from a position of popularity and admiration, and his is a striking example of the fact that no matter how popular or prominent a man is he cannot defy public morals and get away with it.

"The fact that the Canadian public vigorously criticized Fatty, a popular favorite, for his part in the stenchful affair, is one of the encouraging signs of the times, and one that the movie heads should pay heed to.

"And now comes the slaying of William Desmond Taylor, with all its mystery, scandalous and love letters, to further disgust all clean-minded citizens.

Flays All Corruption.

"Many of the same emotions and impulses that corrupt men and women give full rein to also stir the hearts of decent folk.

"The Dominion is as clean as it is because most of its citizens are men and women who practice self-restraint, and obey the commandments of God. The conventions of society and the fear of public opinion are responsible in others.

"But nothing more true was ever spoken than that sin soon too often becomes a familiar face, and finally a thing that we embrace. In this lies the condemnation of certain movie offerings and all allied cussedness in some of the pictures thrown on the screen and in plays acted.

"Girls their teens under ordinary circumstances abhor all that which is not best in womanhood. Yet suggestiveness is flaunted in their faces day after day on the screen or on the stage until their shame is dissipated, and they witness in pictures without a blush things there is not one chance in a hundred of them ever seeing in everyday life.

"Newspapers are often compelled as a matter of news to publish a certain amount of scandal, distasteful as it is to all editors, but it is because in this country scandal is still something out of the ordinary, and out of the ordinary things are news, but that is no excuse for the movies to cater to sinful impulses.

"The matter of public morals is so vital to the health and prosperity and happiness of any community that it should not be difficult to enact laws prohibiting the exhibition of certain types of pictures. If a few public-spirited producers and exhibitors will set the pace, the entire industry will follow, and the undesirable picture and actor and actress will disappear from the earth as completely as the dinosaur."

IS ALIVE, BUT HE MUST PROVE IT

MONTREAL, Feb. 10. — Jerome Bellevue will probably be the first living being to form the subject of an inquest, which will take place tomorrow morning concerning the existence or non-existence of a man by that name whose body was identified and who was buried six months ago, after being dragged from the Lachine canal.

The body was identified by a Mrs. Bellevue, of Lachine, as that of her husband who had been missing for several days. An inquest was held, a verdict of accidental death returned and the corpse interred.

For a while all went well, and Mrs. Bellevue prepared to marry again. Her horror, therefore, can be imagined when the other day the "ghost" of her husband returned and claimed the right to occupy his former position. The case was therefore brought to the attention of the coroner. The "ghost" claimed that he had been serving a six months' sentence in jail.

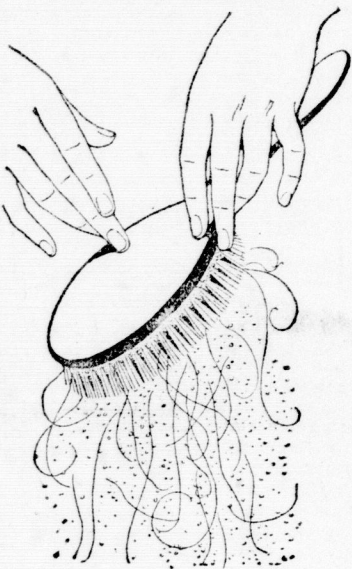

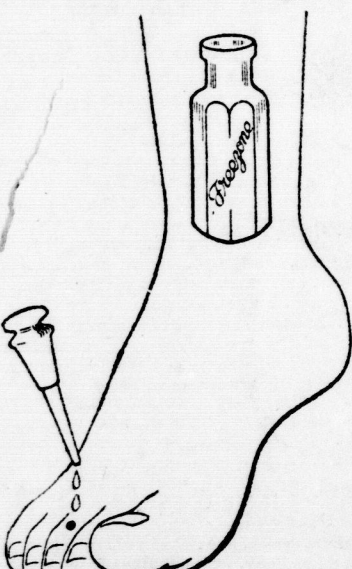

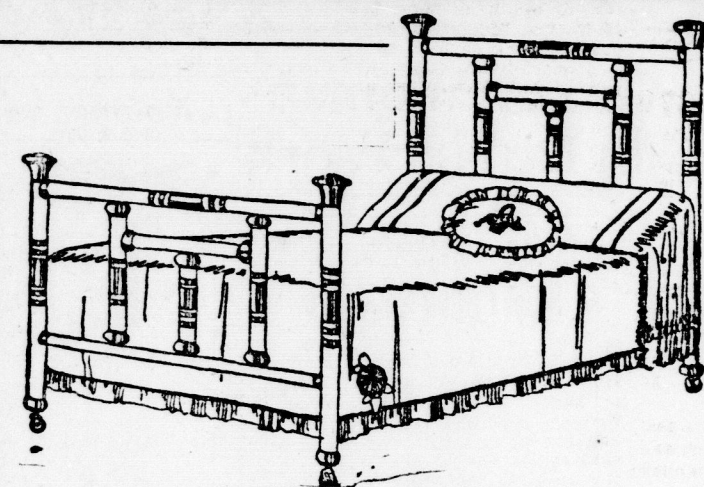
