CLEMENTSVALE

A Beautiful Village Four Miles From
Clementsport Station

Clementsvalle, though not well known by everybody, is nevertheless a beautiful little village in Nova Scotia, about four miles from the station of Clementsport, from which a mail is faithfully carried daily by Mr. Albert Brown, who also conveys passengers.

Clementsvalle is connected with Annapolis Royal, twelve miles east, and Bear River, five miles west, by a highway so excellent, as in itself to be an inducement to motoring or driving parties.

There are only a few public buildings, but they are as fine as you will find in any similar village. A beautiful river also adds to the beauty of the place.

The first public building to describe, is the Methodist church. On the left on your way to Bear River, you see this church, built very plain to those who only see the outside, but the interior is beautiful indeed. This is one of the out stations from Bear River and service is held here on the fourth Sunday of every month at 3 p. m. The pastor is Rev. John W. O'Brien, who has filled his four years here. Organist is Miss Lydia Trimmer, a much loved member of the church. To the right of the church, stands a dry goods and grocery store, owned by Mr. and Mrs. B. Dukeshire. Over this store is a nice hall that can be rented by the week or evening, at a reasonable price from the owner of the store.

Just across the street is the public school. It is a large two-department school. The principal is Miss Iva Tosh, a resident of Belleisle. The other teacher is Miss Alice Potter, a resident of Clementsvalle.

A few rods from this stands the Baptist church. This from the outside, looks more stylish than its sister church, but is not so beautiful inside. It has a nice tower and bell. Service here every Sunday, a. m. at 11 and the evenings of the 1st, 3rd and 5th Sundays at 7.30. Friday night, prayer meetings at 7.30. Pastor Rev. O. P. Brown. The organist is the pastor's wife.

We will not forget the Baptist parsonage, a few minutes' walk from the church. It is a nice large comfortable home for the minister and his family.

The post office is not at all large, but holds the mails alright. The post master is Mr. Charles W. Trimmer, assisted by Mrs. R. J. Baird. The mails leave every day at 11 a. m., returning at 2.30 p. m.

There are no hotels here, but two nice boarding houses. Pleasant View Cottage is owned by a widow, Mrs. Margaret Trimmer, is about ten minutes' walk from the churches or post office. It is on a hill which affords it its name. The other is owned by Mr. A. Chute and is not named. These are two nice places for spending a vacation at all seasons.

There is not a doctor within five miles, but the telephone makes your troubles less, as the doctors own cars and are with you in a few minutes. The nearest doctors are L. J. Lovett and J. D. Dinsmore, of Bear River. Both have a large practice and are very popular.

Clementsvalle is a busy place for so small a village. Almost every one is a farmer and not afraid of work. Some of the young folks are teachers. There is a stove mill owned by Ramsay and Deeler, which gives work to a few men for months at a time; also a shingle mill, two miles from the village, owned by Mr. Ivan C. Trimmer, besides the cooper shop, two blacksmiths and undertaking establishment.

Very few in the place own cars, but what is nicer than a good horse and carriage?

LIFT EMBARGO ON
LOBSTER SHIPMENT

Express Companies Accede to Boston Request

WASHINGTON, April 8.—Assurances that the embargo on the shipment of lobsters, west of New York, recently imposed by the express companies, would be immediately lifted, was given Friday to a delegation of Boston business men by representatives of the express companies.

The delegation was composed of P. J. Connolly, chairman; A. C. McLoon, H. I. Hicks, John J. Cox and Albert Johns who were accompanied by ex-Mayor John F. Fitzgerald.

A hearing before express company officials was held in New York recently and then delegates proceeded to Washington, where they got in touch with representatives of the director general of railroads and officials of the express companies.

The Boston men showed that the continuation of the embargo would work an especial hardship on men engaged in the lobster trade because the season was just opening. The express company's representatives said a night refrigerator car would be put on to take care of shipments west of New York and that the service would be continued daily.

Representatives Tague and Gallivan, accompanied the delegation on their visit to the various Washington officials.

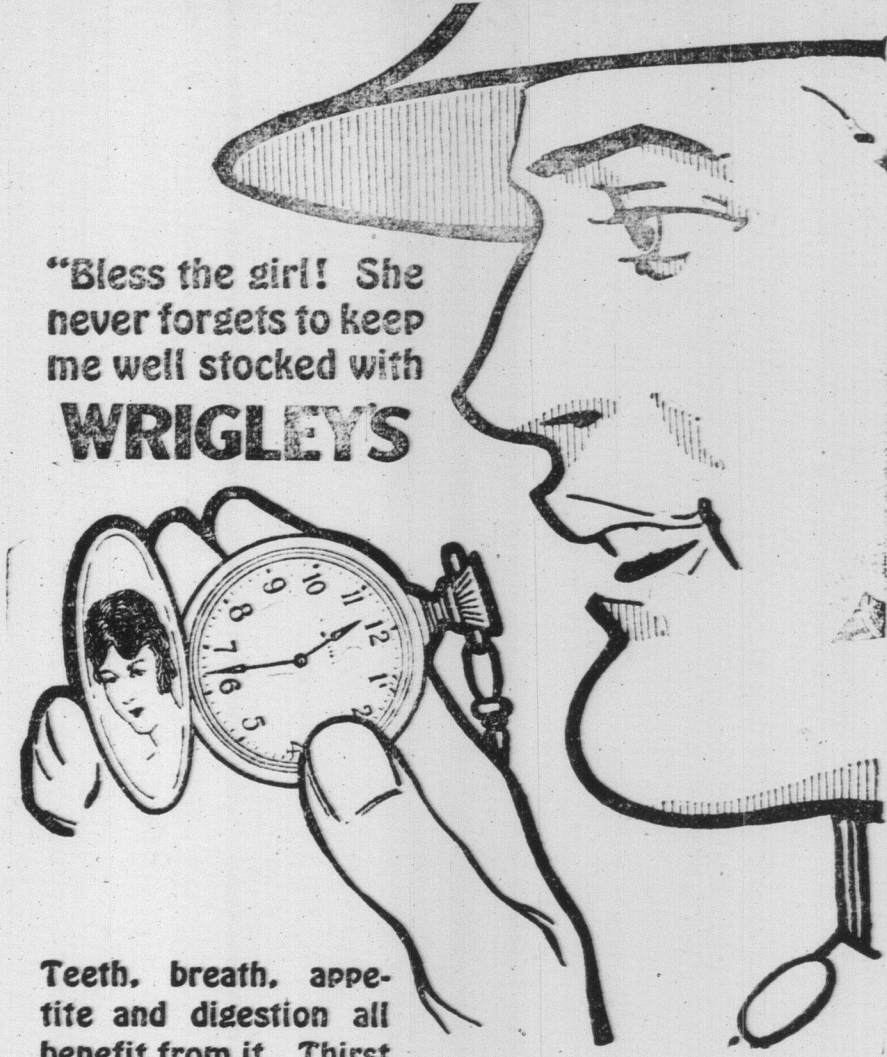

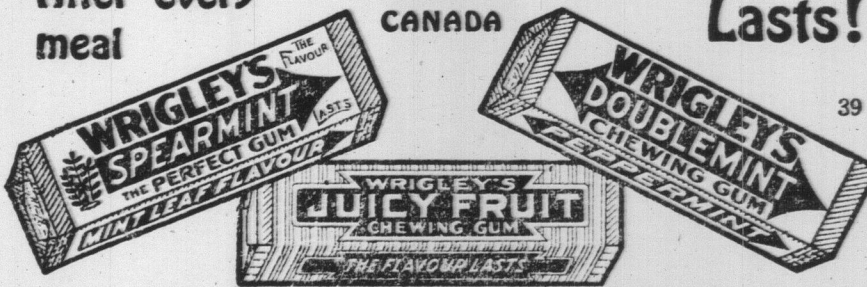
