LESSON 5.] PAUL'S MINISTRY IN CORINTH. |AUGUST 1.

Acts 18. 1-11.

GOLDEN TEXT.—Other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.—1 Cor. 3. 11.

MEMORY VERSES, 8-11. (Read verses 12-22, and 1 Cor., chaps. 1, 2 and 3.) —And Crispus, the chief ruler of the synagogue, believed on the Lord with all his house; and many of the Corinthians hearing believed, and were baptized.

Then spake the Lord to Paul in the night by a vision, Be not afraid, but speak, and hold not thy peace:

For I am with thee, and no man shall set on thee to hurt thee: for I have much people in this city.

And he continued there a year and six months, teaching the word of God among them.

To the folks at home : Please help the little folks to learn this lesson.

LESSON STORY.

Paul left Athens and went to Corinth, a very gay city in Greece. He stayed with Aquila, a Jew, and his wife Priscilla, who were tentmakers like himself. Every Sabbath Paul taught in the synagogue, or place of prayer; but, although he preached so earnestly, only a few Jews believed on Jesus. The others were so angry that he stopped going to the synagogue and began to preach in the house of a man named Justus. Many Gentiles became Christians. Paul stayed in Corinth a year and a half, and the Lord kept him from all harm as he had promised.

1. What kind of a city was Corinth?

A gay city, where the people liked feasts, and dances, and games.

2. With whom did Paul stay? With Aquila and Priscilla.

3. Why did he cease preaching in the synagogue? Because the Jews became angry and would not attend.
