LESSON 5.] PAUL'S MINISTRY IN CORINTH. [AUGUST 1.

Acts 18. 1-11.

GOLDEN TEXT.—Other foundation can no man lay than that is laid, which is Jesus Christ.—1 Cor. 3. 11.

MEMORY VERSES, 8-11. (Read verses 12-22, and 1 Cor., chaps. 1, 2 and 3.)  
—And Crispus, the chief ruler of the synagogue, believed on the Lord with all his house; and many of the Corinthians hearing believed, and were baptized.

Then spake the Lord to Paul in the night by a vision, Be not afraid, but speak, and hold not thy peace:

For I am with thee, and no man shall set on thee to hurt thee: for I have much people in this city.

And he continued there a year and six months, teaching the word of God among them.

*To the folks at home: Please help the little folks to learn this lesson.*

## LESSON STORY.

Paul left Athens and went to Corinth, a very gay city in Greece. He stayed with Aquila, a Jew, and his wife Priscilla, who were tent-makers like himself. Every Sabbath Paul taught in the synagogue, or place of prayer; but, although he preached so earnestly, only a few Jews believed on Jesus. The others were so angry that he stopped going to the synagogue and began to preach in the house of a man named Justus. Many Gentiles became Christians. Paul stayed in Corinth a year and a half, and the Lord kept him from all harm as he had promised.

## LESSON QUESTIONS.

1. What kind of a city was Corinth?

*A gay city, where the people liked feasts, and dances, and games.*

2. With whom did Paul stay?

*With Aquila and Priscilla.*

3. Why did he cease preaching in the synagogue?

*Because the Jews became angry and would not attend.*
