The Collegiate Course of the Faculty of Medicine of McGill University, begins in 1829, on Thursday, September 21st, and will thus until the beginning of June, 1909.

The Primary subjects are taught as far as possible practically, by individual instruction in the laboratories, and the final work by Clinical instruction in the wards of the Hospitals. Based on the Edinburgh model, the instruction is chiefly bed-side, and the studint personally investigates and reports the cases under the supervision of the Professors of Clinical Medicine and Clinical Surgery. Each Student is required for his degree to have acted as Clinical Clerk in the 3dedical and Surgical Wards for a period of 5ts in months each, and to have presented reports acceptable to the Professors, on at least ten cases in Medicine and ten

period of MX months each, and to make present of the period of MX months each, and to make present years in extending the University buildings and laboratories, and equipping the different departments for practical work.

The Faculty provides a Reading Room for Students in connection with the Medical Library which contains ove 20,000 volumes, the largest Medical Library in connection with any University in America.

MATRICULATION.—The matriculation examinations for entrance to Arts and Medicine are held in June and September of each year.

The entrance examinations of the various Canadian Medical Boards are accepted.

FEES.—The total fees including Laboratory fees and dissecting material, \$125 per session.

Courses.—The REGULAR COURSE for the Degree of M.D.C.M. is four sessions of about nine months each.

A DOUBLE COURSE leading to the Degrees of B.A. and M.D.C.M., of six years has been arranged.

ADVANCED COURSES are given to graduates and others desiring to pursue special or research work in the Laboratories of the University, and in the Clinical and Pathological Laboratories of the Royal Victoria and Montreal General Hospitals.

A POST GRADUATE COURSE is given for Practitioners during May and June of each year. This course consists of daily lectures and clinics as well as demonstrations in the recent advances in

sear. This course consists of daily lectures and clinics as well as demonstrations in the recent advances in Medicine and Surgery, and laboratory courses in Clinical Bacteriology, Clinical Chemistry and Microscopy, HOSPITALS.—The Royal Victoria, the Montreal General Hospital and the Montreal Maternity Hospital are utilised for purposes of Clinical instruction. The physicians and surgeons connected with these are the clinical professors of the University.

These two general hospitals have a capacity of 250 beds each and upwards of 30,000 patients received treatment in the outdoor department of the Montreal General Hospital alone, last year.
