

ONTARIO RIFLE ASSOCIATION MATCHES.

The first day was not such a one as delights the heart of the ordinary rifleman, for when the first gun sounded at 10 o'clock the rain was falling in what is ordinarily called a Scotch mist. The first regular match to be fired was the "Canada Company," which commenced at 1 p.m., and, despite the unfavourable rain, there were several very good scores made.

"Canada Company."—Presented by the Canada Company of London, Eng., with \$50 added by Col. C. S. Gzowski, A.D.C. to the Queen. Restricted to the active militia of Ontario who have never won a prize at any provincial or Dominion rifle association match, not including consolation matches. Description of rifle—Class I. (S.) Ranges—400 and 500 yards. Number of rounds at each range—Five. Position—400 yards kneeling (Hythe), 500 any. Battalion team prizes to be competed for by six previously named officers, non-commissioned officers, or men from any battalion, brigade of garrison or field artillery, or squadron of cavalry of active militia of Ontario. Teams unlimited.
