Germany, where there is so much written about every topic of religion, the works of Dr. Channing have now, and will continue to have a most wholesome and purifying influence upon the tone of thought. I regard Dr. Channing, next to Washington, as the great man of America. It is an honor to any country to have produced in a single century two such men."

Our conversation was continued for nearly two hours, mostly on topics connected with the history of liberal opinions, and the probable spread of Unitarian faith. About sunset he left the vehicle at a little town in the valley, repeating, as we parted, his joy at having seen a man who had known Dr. Channing. The other travellers had seen with amazement his enthusiasm, not understanding a word of what he had been saying. But the wonderful scenery of that valley of the Upper Rhine will ever be associated in my mind with this strange and exciting interview.
