

49th Parallel, showed some 15 exhibitions of artists and photographers, including works by Noel Harding and Pierre Beaugarts, and the video presentation by Elke Town. Canadian writers such as Anne Marriot, Thomas Wright, Louis Caron and Alice Munro also toured the United States. The Canadian pavilion at Energy Expo 82 in Knoxville, Tennessee explained the Canadian energy scene at this highly successful exhibition which attracted 11 million visitors.

In the spring of 1982, the United States launched the Youth Exchange Initiative, aimed at increasing youth exchange programs among the seven economic summit nations, and Canada has responded positively. Also during the year, the Canadian Studies Association in the United States took the important step of setting up a permanent office.
