

Mr. POWER: Yes, the buildings include the hangars.

Mr. RALSTON: Just to complete the matter referred to by the leader of the opposi-

tion, in connection with the expenses paid or incurred under the National Resources Mobilization Act, and for the benefit of hon. members, I should like to place this statement on *Hansard*:

The committee will understand that one cannot separate the cost of the so-called thirty day training scheme from the cost of the four months plan; that is to say, the same equipment, the same buildings, the same staff and the same ordnance stores and other items will be used. We have endeavoured as far as possible to make a rough separation by means of the classifications "recurring" and "non-recurring."

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): I used that only as a descriptive term.

Mr. RALSTON: These establishments are available for whatever training plan may be carried on.

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): Then there are the figures from the Department of National War Services.

Mr. RALSTON: The Minister of National War Services gives me this statement of payments by his department. The amount shown

with regard to transportation, to which my hon. friend referred, is only \$87.43, but the minister tells me that this was the amount actually paid out to December 31. The commitment in this respect is \$170,000.

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): Does that include the cost of landing trainees at the centres?

Mr. RALSTON: Yes.

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): Where is shown the cost of sending them back home?

Mr. RALSTON: That is in the statement I just gave, \$197,076.43.

Mr. HANSON (York-Sunbury): Then what we were speculating about last night is correct; War Services delivers them to the training centres and National Defence pays their way home, so there is no duplication.

Mr. RALSTON: These figures are as follows:
