Mr. Deputy Speaker: Pursuant to—

Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre): I rise on a point of order, Mr. Speaker. I realize that under Standing Order 75(11), Mr. Speaker may defer calling in the members for taking a recorded vote, but for two reasons, it might be better to take the vote now. My first reason relates to the general interest in this amendment. My second reason is that our views on the next amendment could well depend on whether the minimum wage is \$1.75 or \$2. I ask Your Honour to determine the general consensus of the House as to whether the vote should be taken now or deferred.

Mr. Mackasey: Mr. Speaker, I will do whatever the hon. member suggests because of the cooperation that has been extended to me by the opposition parties in expressing their willingness to pass the committee and third reading stages today, preferably by supper time. I certainly accede to the request of the hon. member.

Mr. Alexander: Mr. Speaker, it is not our intention in this party to be uncooperative. I appreciate these circumstances which have been expressed. We in this party accept the suggestion made by the hon. member.
