



ARCHEOLOGICAL MAP OF THE TOWNSHIP OF TAY.

EXPLANATIONS. - The small squares indicate the village sites; each enclosed number refers to the description in the text. The heavy dots at Nos. 9, 10, and 14 indicate the bonepits. Dotted lines show the courses of forest trails (now obliterated). The three dotted patches show the positions of boulder-stone tracts devoid of village sites. The heavy curving lines show the positions of two abandoned lake beaches, and these give the altitude of the land: (1) the higher or Algonquin beach is fringed internally to show the higher hills, (2) the lower or Great Nipissing beach encircles many extinct islands.

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
