SHAW ST. DUMP
TO DISAPPEAR

No More Garbage Will Be Deposited and Nuisance Disappears.

TERAULAY ST. WIDENING

Work Soon Starts on Improvement North of College Street.

About one hundred men and women from Shaw street descended upon the civic works committee yesterday afternoon and demanded prompt relief from the stench of the Shaw street dump north of Bloor street. Each of the complainants told a tale of misery one declaring that garbage collected at back doors dumped at front doors. "A seething mass of maggots, flies and rats," was one description of the dump.

Ald. McBride said he had visited the Shaw dump recently and it was awful. He moved that the dump be covered with earth at once, and no more garbage taken there.

Commissioner Harris said until incinerators are established there must be dumps such as at Shaw street. He admitted that it would take two or three years to establish incinerators. "There'll be no more dumping of garbage at the Shaw street dump," Chairman Dunn declared to the deputations when Ald. McBride's motion was unanimously adopted.

Another motion was put thru to have Commissioner Harris report upon the condition of all the garbage dumps in the city.

A deputation of the East End Ratepayers' Association asked that gates be placed at Woodbine avenue crossing, instead of an electric bell, the bell not working in bad weather. Evidence is to be given to the Dominion Railway Board of the failure of the bell to protect the crossing.

Teraulay Widening.

Discussing the widening of Teraulay street, Ald. Weston declared emphatically against an 88 foot width and insisted that the people should first vote upon so large a change.
