obtain fatisfaction and redrefs for the public; and he has been accordingly amply informed which ought to be confidered as having complyed with the directions of the Chief Judge intimated to me by Letter from Edward William Gray Efqr. as above mentioned.---The Attorney General's antwer and refolution will appear in my third memorial annexed; addreffed to his Honor the Chiff Judge dated 4th Inftant.
