BOOMING PRICE OF WHEAT

Chicago Futures Advanced About Three Cents.

Reports of Serious Damage to Growing Winter Crop Being Freely Circulated, but Too Much Dependence Should Not Be Placed Upon These Stories Yet—Notes.

Wednesday Evening, March 29.

Liverpool wheat futures to-day closed 3/4 to 3/8 above yesterday's final figures.

Paris wheat was steady to 2 centimes lower for the day, as was also Paris flour.

The Chicago wheat pit was excited to-day. The higher cables and further crop damage reports caused heavy buying and covering by shorts, with the result that the May option advanced 2 1/2 cts., and the July option 3 cts. per bushel.

Argentina—The supplement to the Corn Trade News, March 25, gives a list of 133 steamer and sailing vessels loading or to load at Argentine ports as at that date.

Exports at New York to-day: Flour, 7032 barrels and 6164 sacks; wheat, 103,091 bushels.

Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day, 238,000 bushels, 338 cars the corresponding day of last year.

Foreign Wheat for Europe.

In the early part of the season The World estimated that three of the important wheat importing countries of the world—France, Belgium and Holland—would probably require about the same quantity of foreign wheat during the crop year 1898-99 as they did during 1897-98.

In the first five months, Aug. 1 to Dec. 31, the importing countries on the Continent purchased foreign wheat much more freely than the United Kingdom, the shipments to the former exceeding those to the latter by about 5,000,000 bushels.

The Corn Trade News makes the shipments to the United Kingdom and the Continent for the 32 weeks of the season, 20,000,000 bushels more than the requirements; but of this increase 15,000,000 bushels belong to increase in wheat not yet arrived here.

The Corn Trade News reports favorably as to condition of wheat in the United Kingdom, France, Germany, Belgium, Holland, Austria, Hungary, Italy and Spain, with the conditions for winter sowing. Russian prospects have improved, St. Petersburg reports from the Southwest being quite satisfactory. The Balkan Provinces also send favorable reports.
